2. What is the meaning of Baptism?

"Christ died for our sinsHe was buriedHe was raised on the third day." (1 Corinthians 15:3-4)
"For when you were baptized, you were buried with Christ, and in baptism you were also raised with Christ." (Colossians 2:12)
■ It illustrates my as a Christian.
"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" (2 Corinthians 5:17)
"We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a <i>new life</i> ." (Romans 6:4)
Baptism doesn't make you a believer - it shows that you already believe. Baptism does not "save" you, only your faith in Christ does that. Baptism is like a wedding ring - it's the outward symbol of the commitment you made in your heart. This is why we use the phrase, "It's an outward sign of an inward change."
"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faithit is the gift of God - not by works, so that no one can boast." (Ephesians 2:8,9)
Who should be Baptized?
■ Every person who has and in Christ.
"Yet to all who <i>received</i> him, to those who <i>believed</i> in his name, he gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12)
"Those who accepted His message were baptized" (Acts 2:41)
"But when they believedthey were baptized, both men and women." (Acts 8:12)
There is no reason to delay! As soon as you have decided to receive Christ into your life, you can and should be baptized.
